Hoping this note finds everyone happy and healthy in this 3rd Quarter of our 2023-2024 School Year. There is so much to be excited about at Hanalei School! Please allow me this opportunity to brag a little about our students and our

<u>iReady Growth:</u> As you all know, we conduct iReady Diagnostics three times a year to assess how our students are developing towards proficiency. I am happy to report that from the beginning of the year to the most recent iReady assessment there has been significant growth. In ELA our students have progressed from 39% proficiency to 65%, and in Math from 31% proficiency to 60% proficient. This is a testament to the dedication of our students, teachers and families. Great job Hanalei School Ohana. Let's keep up the great work to close the gap by the end of the school year.

Extra- Curricular Activities: We are very excited about our upcoming Hanalei School Drama Club production of Moana Jr. that will be premiering on March 8th and 9th in our Hanalei School Cafeteria. Complete with drama, song, dance, sets and costumes, our students and teachers have been rehearsing to bring to life Moana's story of courage and guest. Please mark your calendars for this wonderful event. In addition to our drama club, this quarter we are also offering Art, Jr. Art, Chess, Garden, Props Photography and Entrepreneurial Club. Most recently, our Entrepreneurial Club has started an after school pop-up to practice their entrepreneurial skills. Please support them in their ventures! I would like to take this opportunity to honor Yvette Amshoff for volunteering her time to organize our clubs. Without her efforts and the efforts of our other community partners who teach our clubs, none of this would be possible. I personally ask each one of you to consider sharing your passions with our students by taking on an after school club in the guarters to come.

Facilities: Upon your return from winter break you may have noticed all the facilities updates. WASC Accreditation: With the hard work of our teachers and administration team, in addition to a considerable amount of support from district support personnel, I am happy to report that we have completed our 112 page self-study document. The next step will be to host the visiting committee at our school from 2/26-2/29. It is our great hope that at the end of the visit we receive a 6 year accreditation. We will keep you posted.

Social Emotional Learning: This quarter we study the Choose Love lessons of Forgiveness. According to founder Scarlett Lewis, Forgiveness means choosing to let go of anger and resentment toward yourself or someone else, to surrender thoughts of revenge, and to move forward with your personal power intact. There are scientifically proven benefits for those who practice Forgiveness. On another social emotional note, one theme that has been coming up this guarter is the power of words and choosing language of aloha that builds each other up rather than puts each other down. I encourage each family to reinforce this lesson at home with your keiki.


Stars and Goals...Here we come!!!



2nd graders are learning all about time and money! They are learning how to tell time digitally and with an analog clock. They are learning how to tell time to the nearest hour, five minute increments, and to read it in a variety of ways, for example: 2:30, two-thirty, half past 2, and 30 minutes after 2. They are also learning about money.

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They are learning how to identify the various coins and bills and what their values are.







In Science, students are learning about the 3 states of matter: solid, liquid and gasses. Students are learning to describe their properties using grade-level vocabulary terms such

as flexible or rigid. To end the unit, students will



apply what they've learned when they design and engineer towers. They will be using solid objects as their base to create a sturdy structure. We are extremely excited to get our hands busy on this project!
