Approve Minutes

- Approve minutes from 10/22/22 meeting - Motion moved by Kerrin Murphy, seconded by Julie, all approved.

Administration Report - Deena Moraes

- Choose Love curriculum/ Teacher PLCs addition to our programming- Sarah Bonte is teaching this program, positive feedback from teachers.
- Goal is to close the achievement gap, using RTI support for this. For 2023-2024 school year the projected numbers are 190 students at \$5100/each, will receive additional funding for SPED program.
- State average is about 26 students to 1 teacher. Hanalei is around 14:1, but to maintain this, the school has to have 3 teacher positions funded. PTA and HSF have agreed to fund one line each. Deena has applied for WSF Reserve Funds (\$203,937 - which would cover 2 teacher lines, .5 academic coach, .5 RTI Coordinator). Also trying for District Special Ed Funds but that would require additional staff.
- ESSER Funds are a definite. This 3rd drop is going to Complex Area, not specific schools and these funds are for consumables.
- Push to get parents to CARE about Hanalei School and PTA
 - Kindergarten Orientation - get new parents involved and signed up for positions/committees. Same with all new parents.
 - Build relationships with community partners
 - Get the message out that non Title 1 Schools (Hanalei) need the most money.

PTA and HSF Reports:

- PTA Report - merchandise selling well, looking into more fundraising ideas - mailers to community, larger fundraisers. Will be providing pizza and hot chocolate for the Holiday Craft Night, will encourage parents to sign up for PTA committees, will also sell merchandise.
- Hanalei School Foundation (HSF) Report - holding a Holiday Craft Night, 1/13/22 5-7pm, in the school cafeteria - 10 craft booths, free for Hanalei families. Goal to promote community/family engagement. Will have Student Council help run the booths.
