Old Business:

- Approval of 9/29/16 minutes - Motion by Polly, Seconded by Laura
- Safe Routes to School: Tahara'a Stein presented PTSA minutes regarding Safe Routes to School. PTSA Parents are taking the project on. Discussion about Safe Routes to School goals, implementation and guidelines. Proposal to have students dropped off and walking from Pine Trees or other Weke Road area off highway, and discussion about potential parking concerns.

Committee Reports:

- Parking - Polly: Road/Driveway East of campus is single lane farmers road - not an option for school use. Tahara'a - informed SCC that busses have now been requested to begin using the driveway behind the Cafeteria for afternoon loading to reduce traffic congestion (morning drop off in current location still). Transition time (~2 weeks), but request has been made.
- Farm to School Program: Rosemary Vali - met with HI USDA coordinator for Student Health and Nutrition and Farm to School programs. Fresh Fruit and Vegetable program - just for Title 1 schools. USDA sets nutrition/meal guidelines

at public schools. DOE has adopted goal to have as much Locally sourced produce/food as possible. USDA Grants possible to help implement Farm to School program (Planning Grant application due 12/8/16). Shared Slideshow about program guidelines. Program is a partnership between USDA, Malama Kauai, and School community (PTSA, North Shore community foundations, our garden, farmers, other schools - especially Kilauea). Process involves planning, laying groundwork for a successful program, with USDA support and guidance. Those still in attendance agreed we should go for it, and try applying for the grant this year. Rosemary will connect with PTSA and USDA and Malama Kauai to start momentum for applying for this program.
