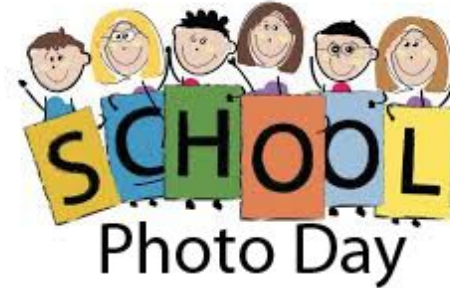

Student Transportation Services Quarterly Payment Plan Notice School Year 2018-2019

**To: Parents and Guardians of School Bus Riders
Who Selected the Quarterly Payment Option**

This is a friendly reminder that school bus riders who are on the Quarterly Payment Plan must purchase their new bus pass prior to the start of the next academic quarter (as scheduled below) if they wish to continue riding the bus after the break.

Please remit your payment to the school office either in person or by mail (do not mail cash) on or before the due dates listed below. Payments made by check, money order or cashier's check should be made payable to "Department of Education."

As a reminder, there is a \$25 service fee for all returned checks (payable to "Director of Finance"), and a \$5.00 fee to replace a permanent bus pass.

1st Quarter:	Round-Trip = \$72.00	One-Way = \$36.00	Due by: August 6
2nd Quarter:	Round-Trip = \$72.00	One-Way = \$36.00	Due by: October 5
3rd Quarter:	Round-Trip = \$72.00	One-Way = \$36.00	Due by: December 21
4th Quarter:	Round-Trip = \$72.00	One-Way = \$36.00	Due by: March 15

Drop-off / Pick-up by parent

- Students need to exit the vehicle out of one of the right hand side passenger doors.
- Please keep traffic flowing along the red curb; there is no parking allowed at the red curb.

Information on SMS text messaging and Short Codes:

SMS stands for Short Message Service and is commonly referred to as a "text message". Most cell phones support this type of text messaging. Our notification provider, SchoolMessenger, uses a true SMS protocol developed by the telecommunications industry specifically for mass text messaging, referred to as "short code" texting. This method is fast, secure and highly reliable because it is strictly regulated by the wireless carriers and only allows access to approved providers. If you've ever sent a text vote for a TV show to a number like 48999, you have used short code texting.

Our mass messaging program, SchoolMessenger, will go live with automated attendance messaging on **August 20, 2018**. On this day, at approximately 10:00 am, parents will receive a text message (see attachment) giving them the opportunity to opt into the texting portion of the SchoolMessenger program.

Please ensure your parents are aware of this opportunity because SchoolMessenger will only send this text message once. However, if parents fail to opt in at this time, they can still go to the SchoolMessenger website (www.schoolmessenger.com) and download their app to opt in. Note: If parents choose to opt in, the actual ability for them to receive text messages won't occur until two weeks after their initial opt-in date.
