It's hard to believe we have started our third quarter already and recently celebrated the 100th day of school.

January marks the beginning of a new year, a new semester, new experiences, and new learning opportunities. We are excited about the months ahead and what we have accomplished so far during the school year. We continue to focus on our General Learner Outcomes (GLO) each week. These are the overarching goals of standards-based learning for all students in all grade levels. Our teachers rely upon rubrics built upon these to inform their assessment of students — going beyond academic achievement to ensure students become engaged, lifelong learners. It is our hope that you will help reinforce these standards at home. The state-wide GLOs are:

- Self-directed Learner (The ability to be responsible for one's own learning)
- Community Contributor (The understanding that it is essential for human beings to work together)
- Complex Thinker (The ability to demonstrate critical thinking and problem solving)
- Quality Producer (The ability to recognize and produce quality performance and quality products)
- Effective Communicator (The ability to communicate effectively)
- Effective and Ethical User of Technology (The ability to use a variety of technologies effectively and ethically)

With a new year comes new opportunities for our students to set both academic and health related goals. Our school is proud to partner with the American Heart Association through the **KIDS HEART CHALLENGE** program! This fun community service program educates our students on physical and social-emotional well-being to positively impact the whole child. 

1st GRADE





2nd GRADE

Students are writing New Year's Resolutions with personal, school and home goals. In Math, we are practicing our subtraction flash cards and learning about double digit subtraction with regrouping. In Science, we are preparing for the science expo by performing experiments in class and learning about the scientific method.



3rd GRADE

4th GRADE

The 4th graders in Ms. Swenson's class are continuing working towards standards while exploring fractions and geometry in math! They will be learning about the Ahupua'a system and will analyze how early Hawaiians used natural resources to meet their needs. Each student will do a mini research slide presentation on either a native or a non-native plant or animal that was available in Hawaii. As part of the science program, Ms. Gallagher's 5th grade class is working with two composting systems in the garden. The first is a red wiggler worm composting system, which the students created during their life science investigations. For the second system, the 5th grade is teaming up with Zero Waste Kauai to build a compost tumbler. Both systems will benefit the garden as well as help with recycling! 


6th GRADE


