### Approve Minutes

- Approve minutes from November meeting- Korin Dunford motioned, Rachelle Ricardo seconded, unanimously approved.

### Administration Report - Tony Sines

#### Academic and Financial Plan Review

- Continuing the RTI for ELA and Math - 30 minute blocks for each class and 6th Grade Study Hall
- Mid Year Data showed good gains - school goal is to get everyone in the green (On or above grade level) At start of school year for Reading: 16% of students in Red (2 or more grade levels below), now 9%, 46% were in Yellow (1 grade level below), now 32%, 37% in Green (at or above grade level) now 60%. For Math: at start of school year - 13% in Red, now 6%, 56% were in Yellow, now 43%, and 31% were in Green, now 52%.
- Each teacher gets their own report on what needs reinforcement, they get overall class data and individual student data. Tony sits down with the teacher, Betty Steed, and Wendy Clark-Parrish to go over info and group students - Tier 1 is grade level and or stretch content, Tier 2 is reinforcement and Tier 3 is more intervention, strengthening of fundamental skills.

#### 2022-2023 Master Schedule

- State has projected enrollment of 219 students, school gets about \$5,000 per student, plus a little more for IEP students.
- School has 5% rollover to fund teacher lines if they don't get the 219 students
- Question is what can the school afford? Generally need 2 teachers at every grade level. The numbers are that the 4th grade class could be combined, but it's a high needs group and better to have 2 teachers.
- Last year PTA funded 2.5 teacher lines, but Tony found that the state has a weighted student formula reserve fund and he put in for 2 teacher lines, 3 PPE, Barton, Sondag, PCNC, SPED EA - total ask is \$287,000. Waiting to hear what, if any, money will be received.

#### General School Info

- Parent volunteers are welcome back on campus with proof of full vaccination or negative test with in 72 hours. Reading with students is great, but would like to see some math help. Parents should coordinate with teachers.

### PTA and HSF Reports:

#### PTA Report - Melanie Parker

- General PTA meeting to be held Tuesday, Jan. 11 at 5pm.

- Hoping to get clubs going in Spring - Drama, basketball, etc. Need to look into budget for these.
- There's about \$60,000 in the general account, which is a shortfall. Looking for a match for Give Big Hawaii. Upcoming fundraisers include: Jog-a-Thon, Read-a-Thon (combined with Book Fair), Merchandise to be sold at Farmers' Markets, Billabong and Frederico's.
- Garden Instructor to be hired to start in January
- Looking to recruit board members for next year

#### Hanalei School Foundation (HSF) Report - Korin Dunford

- Give Big Hawaii has raised \$16,100 so far. It runs through the end of the year.
- Pitch deck is almost finished, they will go over it in January.
- HSF would like to plan with school and PTA on a fundraiser schedule so as not to overlap.
- Possibility that HSF won't last much longer and should have a discussion to merge with PTA
